



#### CONVICTIONS

Arizona convicted 8 defendants in human trafficking cases in 2018, ranking it 12th in the nation for number of defendants convicted.

#### NEW CRIMINAL LABOR TRAFFICKING CASES

Arizona was 1 of 49 states and territories that failed to initiate a criminal labor trafficking prosecution in 2018.

Nationally, the most common type of exploited labor in labor trafficking cases active in 2018 was domestic work. Over half of the active labor trafficking cases involved a defendant using threats of deportation to coerce labor or services.



#### PERCENTAGE OF CONVICTED DEFENDANTS ORDERED TO PAY RESTITUTION



\*1 of the convicted defendants was in a case where the government did not name a trafficking victim in the charging instrument. This conviction has been excluded for purposes of restitution calculations, as it is uncommon for federal courts to order restitution in a case where the government does not identify a trafficking victim (e.g., sting operation cases).

**LIMITATIONS:** The Report's findings are not a prevalence estimate of human trafficking in the United States but instead serve as an objective summary of what the federal system has done to address trafficking. The Report does not capture data from state prosecutions, state civil suits, or unreported human trafficking cases.
