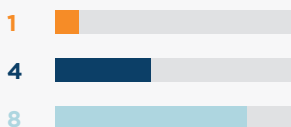
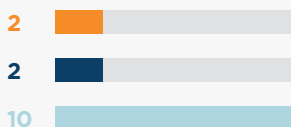


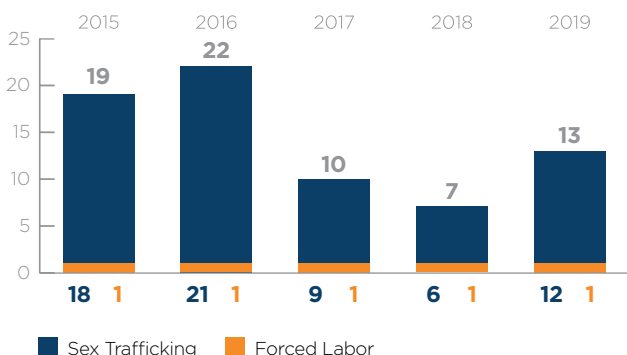

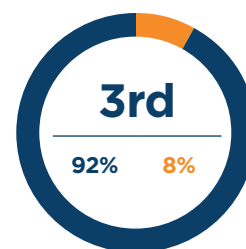

NEW CRIMINAL CASES:

Federal prosecutors in Florida charged **13 new criminal human trafficking cases** in 2019, ranking it 3rd in the nation for number of new cases.

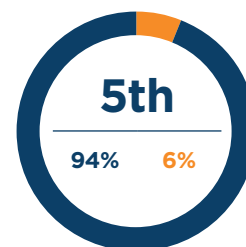
National new criminal cases: 145



ACTIVE CRIMINAL CASES:

Federal courts in Florida handled **33 active criminal human trafficking cases** in 2019, ranking it 5th in the nation for number of active cases.

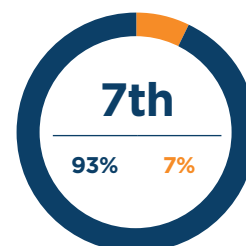
National active criminal cases: 606



CONVICTIONS:

Federal courts in Florida convicted **14 defendants in human trafficking cases** in 2019, ranking it 7th in the nation for number of defendants convicted.

National convictions: 339



RESTITUTION:

Federal judges in Florida ordered **8 out of 13 convicted defendants* to pay restitution** in 2019, ranking it 11th in the nation for percentage of defendants ordered to pay restitution.

National restitution percentage: 33%

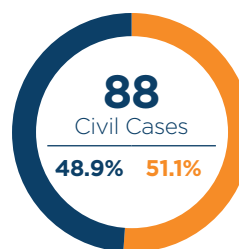

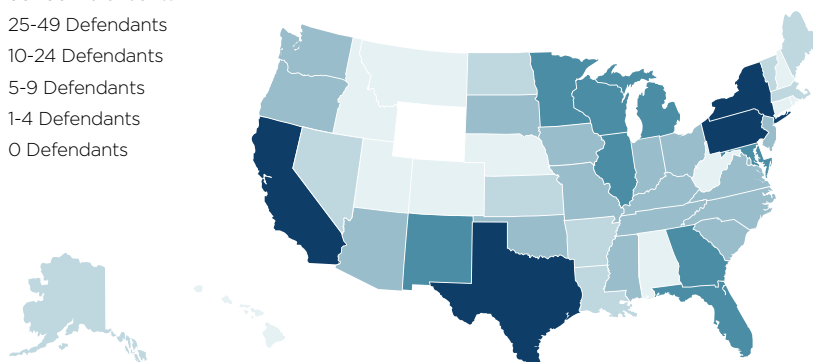
